The AEIOU Foundation strives to provide affordable access to their autism-specific program. AEIOU feels strongly that services should be affordable so that no family should be disadvantaged. To achieve this, the Foundation fundraises and lobbies extensively across Australia.

Our Parent Assistance staff are trained to provide families with support and advice about their fees.

AEIOU is structured to make it possible for many families to claim several government support payments. The value of this support varies according to each family's situation. See overleaf for more information.

AEIOU is committed to ensuring its program is financially accessible, and works closely with government bodies to secure financial aid for families. The Queensland Government currently contributes \$10,777 per child, per year. The above table demonstrates how each family may apply government rebates to offset their fees. *Please note, it is a personal choice to allocate the carers allowance and carers supplement toward annual fees. These rebates can also be applied to other care and household costs.*

Applicable to AEIOU Bray Park, AEIOU Foundation at Nathan Centre, AEIOU Park Ridge, AEIOU Toowoomba and AEIOU Townsville. *Please note, the Nathan Centre operates under two funding programs, the AEIOU Foundation and AEIOU For Children with Autism Ltd. Due to differences in government funding, this fee sheet is not applicable to children enrolled under AEIOU For Children with Autism Ltd.*

*AEIOU's annual fees per placement enable delivery of high level of professional care and inclusion of Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy and autism-specific teaching in the daily program.

**The CCR is issued quarterly to families by the FAO. This can then be forwarded to AEIOU to reduce your balance of fees.

***The CCB maximum is \$5904 and dependent upon the number of hours attended a week and family income.

Lynn Wright Memorial Fund (scholarship funding)

AEIOU offers scholarships for families that apply to the Lynn Wright Memorial Fund and meet the criteria for funding. The Lynn Wright Memorial Fund has an independent board that reviews all applications and any family of Australian citizenship participating in the AEIOU program is eligible to apply. The Carers Allowance and Carers Bonus is considered when determining each scholarship amount. **Application forms are available at www.aeiou.org.au/lynn-wright**

How to Reduce Your Fees

Child Care Benefit (CCB) and Child Care Rebate (CCR)

The Australian Government offers financial assistance to families with the costs of approved child care. The value (or percentage) of this assistance is calculated by the Family Assistance Office (FAO) based on the income of the household and the number of children in care. Call 13 61 50 to determine your eligibility.

Helping Children with Autism (HCWA)

HCWA is a Federal Government support payment to Australian families with a child aged 0-6 years of age diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). This child will have access to a maximum of \$12,000 funding (up to \$6,000 funding per financial year) once they have been deemed eligible to access the Early Intervention Funding Program before their sixth birthday by an authorised Autism Advisor. Families may choose to use their HCWA funding to offset their AEIOU fees.

Carers Allowance

Carers Allowance is a supplementary payment available to a parent or carer who provides additional care and attention on a daily basis for a child aged under 16 years with a physical, intellectual or psychiatric disability. This allowance can be used to subsidise your annual fee as demonstrated overleaf, but can also be used for other care and household costs. How it is used is an individual choice. Jobs, Education and Training (JET) Child Care Fee Assistance

Parents undergoing training, study, job search or rehabilitation to help them enter or re-enter the workforce may be eligible for Federal Government support funding known as JET to cover part of AEIOU's enrolment fees. Eligibility criteria applies. Contact the Family Assistance Office (FAO) on 13 61 50 for more information.
