To coincide with Disability Action Week 2018, children from AEIOU Foundation Camira will be treated to an exciting robotics and storytelling session thanks to the Ipswich Libraries' Sensory Sessions Road Trip.

Library staff will conduct the incursion on **Tuesday 4 September** as part of their highly successful outreach program aimed at local disability support service providers and special schools.

AEIOU Camira Service Manager Louise Nasternak said they were very grateful for the community engagement opportunity.

"As an early intervention provider for children with autism, we're always looking for ways to promote inclusion and encourage learning across different environments and mediums," Ms Nasternak said.
